End-Of-Season Tailgate Party: As the test winds down on **Tuesday afternoon**, Janet Summers is coordinating a tailgate party free to everyone who attends. Come help us celebrate the end of our long and very busy Hunt Test season! NOTE THIS IS THE FIRST DAY OF THE TEST.

We are asking everyone who is interested to please bring a dish to share, either an entrée, appetizer, or dessert. For people coming from away who are staying at a motel for the duration, something simple like store-bought chips, crackers, cheese / meat / fruit / vegetable trays, baked goods, or canned sodas are just fine. The club will supply bottled water, paper plates, napkins and plastic cutlery.

How to get to Brian's Farm:

The address is 1810 State Highway 58 South, Georgetown, TN, near Cleveland and Decatur and not far from Dayton, TN. If you don't have a GPS, here are some more detailed instructions:

- From Interstate 75, take exit 49 for TN-30 towards Decatur.
- Follow TN-30W for 9.3 miles into the stop light in Decatur
- ♦ Turn left onto TN-58S. Stay on this road for 15 miles and turn left into Brian's property. This is just after going up a hill, so be prepared to turn in a hurry as you approach the hill.

There will be "ETRC" signs at the entrance and the gate will be open.

Report: East Tennessee Retriever Club 2024 Fall Hunt Test

Our fall test is in the books.

On a beautiful fall weekend, (October 19-20, 2024) the club put on a double Junior, double Senior, and single flight of Master hunt test at the beautiful Lucky 7 Ranch in Sweetwater. Attendance was down a bit — the Master National just finished two weeks ago, and many people are diverted by other fall activities like Tennessee's Football team which was playing Alabama on Saturday afternoon.

We had 63 entries for the Master tests, of which 6 scratched (several were bitches going into season). Of this number, 36 passed (a 63% pass rate). In the Senior tests, we had 20 entered on Saturday (with 4 scratches) and 17 on Sunday (with 2 scratches). On Saturday, 12 dogs passed (75%). On Sunday, 7 passed (46.7%). Junior Entries on Saturday numbered 12 with no scratches, of which 10 passed (83%) and Sunday, 9 out of 10 passed (90%). The dog that didn't pass on Sunday



managed to break even wearing a collar! Determined little bugger....

Dog Stats:

For those who are interested in this sort of thing, there were a total of 122 dogs entered. Of these, 7 were Chessies, 9 Goldens, 1 Springer Spaniel, 1 Toller, 2 Flatcoats, and the rest (102) were various flavors of Labradors. 41 were female, and 81 were



male. The oldest was born in September 2014 (10 years old!) and the youngest was born November 2023, so less than a year old.





ETRC Members at the Master National 2024

The Master National is over for another year, and the final results are in. Dates were September 21 to October 2, at the West Kentucky Wildlife Management Areas near Paducah, Kentucky. It is tough to run a test this large, so all sympathies and kudos to the Master National committee and the many volunteers for pulling this off. There were a total of 1,131 dogs entered, divided into 9 flights of 140-147 dogs each.

Although this is billed as a National test, it is run basically as 9 individual tests all running on the same grounds. The flights rotated through six test setups at the different areas; however, there were only five series this year (Hurricane Helene) so not every flight ended up at the same areas as every other flight. Also, each flight has the same judges throughout all series, with no swapping around of judges, and dogs are assigned to the individual flights on a mostly regional basis.

All of our members were in Flight G except for Melissa Dobson, who lives in Georgia, and she was in Flight H.

RESULTS:

Flight G: 31% of the dogs entered passed all five series. ETRC members and member dogs who passed all five series and earned a plate are:

- Rader's Charlie Belle MH, owned by Jeff Rader and handled by Jody Ware;
- Troublesome Fowl Addiction MH, owned by John Broucek and handled by Jody Ware;
- L7Troublesomewhataboutbob MH, owned by Bob Smith and handled by Brian Caldwell;
- ◆ Chosen Spot's Splash of Tequila MH, owned and handled by Dennis Wilcox;.

Jody also passed another client dog, as did Brian.

Flight H: 49% of the dogs entered in this flight passed all five series. Congratulations to ETRC member Melissa Dobson, who qualified all 7 of the dogs she handled, including one of her own dogs, and one of her daughter's dogs:

- Southern Comfort's Run Your Tail Off MH; and
- Southern Comfort's Painted With A Punch MH

There was quite a difference in pass rates between the eight flights. They ranged from a low of 31% in Flight G to 51% in Flight E.

Looking through the lists of dogs who qualified and who didn't, in all 8 flights, it's amazing the number of dogs with QA2 and dozens of MA passes (MH101 in one case) and GRHRCH titles who didn't make the grade. There were even a couple of FCs and AFCs who didn't qualify.

Every dog has its off day, but looks like there were a lot of those at this test, or some very picky callback decisions. Even bigger congratulations are due to those who did pass!

Youth Program



The Luthenauer Young Handler program was established as a memorial to ETRC member Kevin Luthenauer. The program is supported by generous contributions from family and friends to encourage youth participation in retriever sports.
